- Security Survey, \$500-1000 more for a patrol car service (71 v 41 households) est125 people responded to survey.
- Question – how many patrol cars.
- What if you already have the service (do you make your own determination)
- SSA – patrol also does Hancock Park (shared vs dedicated to the Brookside neighborhood)
- SSA (10-16) v ADT (60 households)
- ADT Mario, St Crump nightshift watch commander. Private company, patrol car is common ground only. Dedicated customer can have access to property. Increments of 8hr/20k per month. Observe and report but can't really do much to approach (depends how you approach)
- Issue of squatters, proof receiving mail. Inform landlord, and they can then call the police.
- City Attorney; Kimberly M. with the city attorney's office. All of west bureau/Olympic division. Covers a broad terms quality of life issues (ex vacant property, party houses). LADBS enforcement agency that would deal with a vacant property and squatters scenario. LADBS complaint based agency (LA Department of Building and Safety).
- LADBS also has neighborhood prosecutors office.

- Waze + City / stop signs on Rimpau is causing people to cut through the other streets.

- Mullen Alley Brookside Neighbor. Moving into Muirfield.
- Calling for establishing block captains; odd behavior common areas.
- Figure out configuration for pods; notification, communication. Block to block scenario.
- Nextdoor app. 100% participation on app for Mullen, Muirfield 8th and 9th. (goal by EOM)
- Crime is up 12%. All of the above. Suggest Band app. Each block is responsible. Combo of patrol and eyes on the street. Work together to be organized.
- Senior Lead Officer Rodriguez (7:28p) Basic car day and night watch; which can be pulled away from their patrol area. Redeployed
- Dispatch (non-emergency number) 213. 928.8223 where all radio calls are generated (different than Wilshire station number)
- Wilshire station number; Automated system. Total 8 senior lead officers.
